

FAQs

I earned more than 64 credits from a community college. Why didn't they transfer?

UNCC never accepts more than 64 credits from 2-year institutions. Transfer credit evaluators award up to 64 credit hours, and attempt to choose the best courses applicable to your major. If you want to remove a class that doesn't complete any requirements here at UNCC and replace it with a class that will count towards a requirement, contact the Admissions Office.

I took classes that I think should have fulfilled requirements at UNCC. What do I do?

Contact Academic Advising in the Department of Art and Art History in the Rowe Building. You will need to complete the Academic Petition, and they will help you with that.

How do I know what I still need for the general education requirements?

Contact Academic Advising in the College of Arts and Sciences in the Fretwell Building.

I can't figure out how to navigate the web site or my 49er Express. What do I do?

Contact the Student Computing Help Center at 704-687-6400 and press 1. They are available 8-5 M-F.

There is a hold on my account and I cannot register. What do I do?

If it is an 'Advising' hold, contact your assigned faculty advisor from your major (Art, Pre Art or Art History advisees belong to this department). This person is listed in your 49er Express account. Call 704-687-4458 if you can't figure out who that is.

If it is anything other than an 'Advising' hold, contact the Office of Records & Registration.

Can I still take classes at another institution while studying at UNCC?

That depends. If you have or will have earned 90 or more credits before you intend to study elsewhere, the answer is no. If you have earned fewer than that, you may take any summer classes elsewhere with prior approval (fill out a

Transient Study form). If you wish to take a class during the fall or spring, and it is a class that this university offers ever, you may do so with prior approval ONLY if you are a part time student on this campus (11 or fewer credits). If it is a class that UNCC does not have in its catalog, you may do so with prior approval even if you are a full time student here.

Why don't I see my GPA transfer here?

UNCC doesn't transfer GPAs. Yours begins anew here.

How do I know which concentration to choose in the BFA program?

You will want to 'interview' or discuss concentration options with the faculty who are in charge of each area (Area Coordinators). Call 704-687-2473 and ask for the contact information or look in the directory at www.art.uncc.edu. Coordinators are identified by the concentration areas.

I am interested in K-12 Teacher Licensure. What do I do?

Contact Deb Wall at 704-687-4476. She is the Interim Coordinator of Art Education.

Can I earn both a BA in Art and a BFA in Art?

No.

Can I pursue more than 1 concentration in the BFA program?

Yes. Credits are shared as well, so you will not need to repeat common classes.

Can I earn the BA in Art and then return to finish the requirements for the BFA in Art? Yes. You would reapply to UNCC as a Second Degree student (Undergraduate Admissions) and complete the remaining classes. You don't actually earn a second degree; the BA is 'vacated' and replaced with the BFA.

I am confused. What do I do?

Contact Academic Advising in Fretwell for all questions related to requirements other than Art. Contact your assigned faculty advisor in this department for all questions related to Art.
